




- Orientation follows a cascade-model:
 - Orientation on WinS implementation approach for 18 Provincial Officers by national level;
 - Orientation for District Officers by Provincial Offices;
 - District Officers include in regular meetings with their schools
- Follow-up through peer-to-peer Learning Exchanges
 - from school to school through cluster system
 - From district to district to reflect on good practices and solutions to common problems (and create a basis for comparison)
 - From province to province (including visits to schools at different implementation stages)


Role of Provincial Team





Role of Pedagogical Advisors & Cluster Heads





Support the sharing of information about the program and guide schools within their clusters and, if requested, support other districts and provinces by serving as model schools and role models that others could visit and follow

Capacity Development on WinS

- Use of low-cost learning materials (videos, manuals) – videos have proven to be helpful tool to convey the same message by different facilitators
- Encouraging districts/ provinces to start with 1 model and expand from there on the basis of experience and learning exchanges
- Approach allows flexibility on district level: they scale up in their own speed —many districts decided to scale up to all schools and managed the process through exchanges within the clusters quickly!









- Use of existing meetings and structures helped for dissemination and transfer of knowledge
- Learning exchanges helped sharing knowledge and supported practical learning by schools and provincial/district officers
- School clusters became the knowledge hub for sharing implementation experiences and encouraging all schools in the respective cluster
- Pedagogical Advisors and Cluster Heads need to have good technical knowledge, communication and mentoring skills





• Challenges:

- Motivate and encourage provincial and district officials to advocate for WinS and orient schools
- Motivate and encourage schools to implement Wins (establishment of recognition structure)
- Raise awareness on all levels for sustainability of implementation

• Future perspective:

- Continue regular exchange experience internal and external
- Further emphasize WASH in existing meeting and curriculum
